

WHAT DOES GOD SAY ABOUT

After the times of the New Testament when Jesus was born, crucified and resurrected from the dead it became a day that people praised and worship him for his sacrifice. Today we think of the Sabbath as a day that was set aside to worship the resurrection of Jesus Christ rather than a day of rest. "After the Sabbath, at dawn on the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to look at the tomb" (Matthew 28:1) Mary Magdalene then saw that the stone was removed and Jesus was not in the tomb. The Bible also states, "When Jesus rose early on the first day of the week, he appeared first to Mary Magdalene, out of whom he had driven seven demons" (Mark 16:9) emphasizing the significance of the first day, Sunday, Jesus rose on the first day, Sunday, and after that many people began worshipping on that day every week. "On the first day of every week, each one of you should set aside a sum of money in keeping with your income, saving it up, so that when I come no collections will have to be made." (1 Corinthians 16:2) Jesus recognized the Sabbath, so as Followers of Christ we are obligated to do the same on Sunday, the day He rose. - Brianna Michael
