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LEADERSHIP

“Lead me in thy truth, and teach me: for thou art the God of my salvation; on thee do I wait all the day”, [Psalm 25:5 KJV](#)

LEADERSHIP is defined as a person who guides by going in advance and directing people on a specific course or particular way.¹ Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ declares that he is the way ([St. John 14:6](#)). True Christian believers know the Lord’s way, “...men or women there belonging to the Way [believers, followers of Jesus the Messiah]”, [Acts 9:2 AMP](#). Jesus told us that while he was going back to Paradise to be with the Father in Heaven, God the Father would leave a person here on earth to comfort us and guide us along the Lord’s way, “*But the Comforter, which is the Holy Ghost, whom the Father will send in my name, he shall teach you all things, and bring all things to your remembrance, whatsoever I have said unto you*”, [St. John 14:6 KJV](#). Although God gave us examples of leadership when Moses’ father-in-law Jethro explained to him how to choose good men to be leaders over God’s people ([Exodus 18:17-27](#)) and the Apostles gave the Lord’s followers the criterion for choosing leaders in the church, “...choose seven of your men who have a good reputation. They must be full of wisdom and the Spirit”, [Acts 6:3 ERV](#), a leader is still truly defined by his or her character. Many people hold titles of leadership but very few people are genuine leaders. There is only one perfect example of a good leader and that is God, Himself. The Lord tells us Himself that He is perfect, “...as your Father which is in heaven is perfect”, [St. Matthew 5:48 KJV](#). God gave us an example of how to be a good leader through the life of Jesus Christ. God is the Creator so the obvious question is being like Jesus, the perfect leader, attainable for us? God the Father is a person, God the Son is a person and God the Holy Spirit is a person. We were made in God’s image, “*God created man in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them*”, [Genesis 1:27 KJV](#). The author of the book ‘The Holy Spirit’ by Charles C. Ryrie says that we define human personality by what we know but all human personality is imperfect so it is impossible for us to know a perfect personality in and of ourselves. True personality must start with a study of God’s character because God alone has perfect personality.² Jesus Christ demonstrated God’s character when he walked on earth to give us an example of a perfect person. Like father, like son. Jesus and the Father are one, “*I and my Father are one*”, [St. John 10:30 KJV](#). We must try to be like Jesus and as a result, we will be exhibiting godly character. Can we achieve it? The Holy Spirit is our guide but the Lord left us a performance metric to evaluate ourselves to see how we are doing. It is our mouth, “*For in many things we offend all. If any man offend not in word, the same is a perfect man, and able also to bridle the whole body*”, [St. John 10:30 KJV](#). It is not what goes in our mouth that causes problems but it is what comes out of our mouth that hurts our effort to be more like Jesus. We make many mistakes and stumble in many ways but to be good leaders we need to demonstrate good leadership by controlling our tongues. As leaders and examples to God’s people, let’s make sure that what comes out of our mouth brings life to the Body of Christ, “*Let no corrupt communication proceed out of your mouth, but that which is good to the use of edifying, that it may minister grace unto the hearers*”, [Ephesians 4:29 KJV](#).

“Over the Years”

Over the years, I've noticed an increase of a specific trait that has caused tension with the way we (meaning God's children) live our lives. The act of selfishness has allowed people to ignore others and lose sight of truly loving each other. This trait has been around for years, and to me it's always swept under the rug. It's not something that just dwells in millennials, it happens to everyone. This is an issue that needs to be critiqued now. If we decide to continue to be selfish, we will end up falling short of God's word, as well as His glory. The act of selfishness is the lack of consideration for others; concerned chiefly with one's own personal profit or pleasure. Philippians 2:3-4(NLT) says '*Don't be selfish, don't try to impress others. Be humble thinking of others as better than yourselves. Don't look out only for your own interests.*' It's natural for people to care for themselves, but when it's at the expense of someone who may be in need and it ends up affecting them negatively is when the line needs to be drawn. Take David for an example (2 Samuel 11:1-27). One day, David met a woman by the name of Bathsheba, daughter of Eliam and wife of Uriah the Hittite. Bathsheba was taking a bath when David noticed her. He sent his messenger to get her. David and Bathsheba grew close. Bathsheba later found out that she was expecting. Bathsheba sent out the message to David, and in return David sent for Uriah the Hittite, which was her husband. David became friends with Uriah and showed his concern for the war that was going on between the Israelite army and the Ammonites. He then encouraged Uriah to go home, but Uriah felt that he shouldn't wine and dine while the war was still going on. David invited Uriah to stay until the next day where he ended up getting Uriah inebriated. This action wasn't enough to get Uriah to go home. David then wrote a letter to Joab, which Uriah delivered, stating to have Uriah stationed on the front line where the war was the strongest so that way Uriah could be killed. In the end, Uriah was killed alongside other Israelites. When Bathsheba found out that Uriah was killed, she mourned him. While mourning her late husband, David sent out for her and she then became one of his wives.

The Lord was not pleased with the actions David took (2 Samuel 11:1-27). It was selfish of David to be with Bathsheba knowing she was married. It was also selfish of him to become friends with Uriah and then have him killed so that way he can become closer to Bathsheba. This is an example of how selfishness has been around for a long time. Avoiding selfishness isn't as hard as some people make it out to be. Selflessness is the concern more with the needs and wishes of others than with one's own. Being selfless is a trait that everyone should have. Putting others before you should be the way to go for most cases. I say that to say you should always take care of yourself, but if someone that's close to you is in need or seeks encouragement, don't look the other way. 1 Corinthians 13:4-7(NLT) says "*Love is patient and kind. Love is not jealous or boastful or proud or rude. It does not demand its own way. It is not irritable, and it keeps no record of being wronged. It does not rejoice about injustice but rejoices whenever the truth wins out. Love never gives up, never loses faith, is always hopeful, and endures through every circumstance.*" Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ showed selflessness when He died on the cross for our sins. Most of the fields we work in require us to be selfless, though many of us aren't. I say us because I find myself being selfish sometimes. There are plenty of times where I would go to work and say, "I don't want to be bothered with people and their "mess" today." Though people come to my job to fulfill their appetites and have a great dining experience. It's an everyday necessity to eat, so I shouldn't be the one saying that I don't want to be bothered. "*See that no one pays back evil for evil, but always try to do good to each other and to all people (1 Thessalonians 5:15)*" Another important key is to be genuine when you're being selfless. She certainly knows Him as Trustworthy. We are witness to His great power, every time she enters into praise and worship with us, and we exalt His Name together. To God Be the Glory!

Who am I? I know who I was. I was a pitiable, despicable, and contemptible person. At times I was mean and miserable. Many times, I found myself in very unfortunate conditions and circumstances. Apostle Paul gave a vivid description of me, “O wretched man that I am! who shall deliver me from the body of this death?”, **Romans 7:24 KJV**. The Prophet Isaiah was even more graphic, “But we are all as an unclean thing, and all our righteousnesses are as filthy rags”, **Isaiah 64:6 KJV**. Even if I thought for a second that there was at least a little good in me, King David made certain that I knew that wasn’t true, “Every one of them is gone back: they are altogether become filthy; there is none that doeth good, no, not one”, **Psalms 53:3 KJV**. The Prophet Isaiah confirms the fact that I am not alone because he makes it clear that none of us were any good, “All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned everyone to his own way”, **Isaiah 53:6 KJV**. To make sure that we’ve got that point down pat, Apostle Paul reiterates it again, “As it is written, There is none righteous, no, not one”, **Romans 3:10 KJV**. 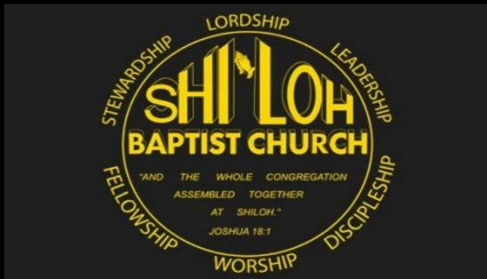
God of heaven hath given - **Daniel 2:37 KJV**

There are many examples of people in the Holy Bible who knew who they really were. We demonstrate true humility when we tell the truth about ourselves, “Who am I, O Lord GOD? and what is my house, that thou hast brought me hitherto?”, **2 Samuel 7:18 KJV**. King David was seen as a man after God’s own heart because David told the truth about himself, “I’m not very important, and neither is my family”, **1 Samuel 18:18 CEV**. People that are honest about themselves know that the truth is that we don’t deserve to be allowed to stand in God’s presence, “Sovereign LORD, I am not worthy of what you have already done for me, nor is my family”, **2 Samuel 7:18 GNT**. It’s a rhetorical question because many of us already know the answer. If you don’t know the answer then ask Moses. Moses was considered the meekest man on earth because he told the truth about himself, “I am nobody”, **Exodus 3:11 GNT**. People that know God personally always ask the same rhetorical question to emphasize a point, “And Moses said unto God, Who am I...?”, **Exodus 3:11 KJV**. Lord, why am I so important to you? Why is my family important? Why have you made me so important? Why have you showered your blessings on such an insignificant person as I am? What is my family, that you have brought me to this place in life? For the honest Christian believer, the answer is always the same, “God, you’ve done all this not because of who I am but because of who you are”, **Exodus 3:11 The Message**. The attitude for those that honestly love the Lord is also always the same, “LORD God, you have done so much for me and my family. And I don’t understand why”, **1 Chronicles 17:16 ERV**. God gives grace to the humble but the humble are those that tell the truth about themselves, “LORD God, my family and I don’t deserve what you have already done for us”, **1 Chronicles 17:16 CEV**. A true demonstration of King Solomon’s wisdom was shown when he asked that same simple question, “... Who am I, and what is my people, that we should be able to offer so willingly after this sort? for all things come of thee, and of thine own have we given thee”, **1 Chronicles 29:14 KJV**. But me, ‘Who am I?’, and who are all the fellow believers that you’ve allowed to be in my life that we should presume to be giving something to you? Everything comes from God and when we give anything back to the Lord all we are doing is giving back what we’ve been given from His generous hand (**1 Chronicles 29:14 The Message**). When we express an attitude of humility and we demonstrate our love for the Lord by obeying His Word then God allows us to do great things for Him, “But who is able to build him an house, seeing the heaven and heaven of heavens cannot contain him? Who am I then, that I should build him an house, save only to burn sacrifice before him?”, **2 Chronicles 2:6 KJV**. When we commit our lives to obeying the Lord’s commands, we should always give Him our best efforts because our God is far better than any other competing gods, beliefs and religions. But if we are honest then we will always ask the same rhetorical question, “‘Who am I?’, to think I can do anything for God? All we are good for is to give sacrifices to Him. We need His help.”⁴ We need Jesus Christ to save us and the Holy Spirit to help us. Nehemiah lets us know that the real indication that we know for ourselves how helpless we really are without the Holy Spirit is what we do when someone asks us what we want in life, “Then the king said to me, “What do you want me to do?” **Before I answered, I prayed to the God of heaven”, Nehemiah 2:4 KJV**.

A Place of Rest

“For he that is entered into his **rest**, he also hath ceased from his own works, as God did from his.”, **Hebrews 4:10 KJV**



The first man that walked on earth entered in through God's rest. Adam didn't breathe his first breath of life until after God finished His work. Man had entered into God's rest. Rest means peace, tranquility and calm.⁵ Rest means to be free from work, labor, or exertion. Rest is a cessation of motion or absence of movement. Rest is inactivity. Rest means having composure. Rest frees us from burdens of responsibility. Rest is synonymous with mental or spiritual calm. Rest is solitude. Rest is a short pause within a line of music. Rest is an interval of silence between tones. Rest means to be still or to stop. We can find rest in a place that provides shelter or lodging after traveling. Rest allows us to lie down, relax and sleep. Rest allows us to relieve weariness and stress.

*When we find a place of rest we also find everything we need. Rest comes with provisions. People don't experience rest if they have worry. Worry and rest don't go together but when we do enter into a place of rest our whole being is at rest including, mind, body and spirit. Adam and Eve entered into God's rest. Their bodies were at rest. Their minds were at rest. Their spirits were at rest. God had given them everything they needed. They were in a place of peace and could rest freely whenever they wanted to. They were free. Rest and freedom go together. God's place is a place of freedom and rest. In the midst of our adversaries God gives His people rest from our burdens, "...ye make them **rest** from their burdens", **Exodus 5:5 KJV**. God gives us rest from our enemies, "...he giveth you **rest** from all your enemies round about, so that ye dwell in safety", **Deuteronomy 12:10 KJV**. God even set aside a day in the week to allow His people to rest from their labor, "So the people **rested** on the seventh day", **Exodus 16:30 KJV**. God's presence in our lives gives us rest, "My presence shall go with thee, and I will give thee **rest**", **Exodus 33:14 KJV**. The world offers an illusion of rest. They lay on their couches and take their vacations without any thought about God's will for their lives, "You people are rushing toward the day of punishment. You bring near the rule of violence. But now you lie on ivory beds and stretch out on your couches", **Amos 6:3-4 KJV**. Many unbelievers live their lives without any thought about tomorrow's consequences, "He had been eating like a king, and he was drunk and feeling good. So, Abigail told Nabal nothing until the next morning. The next morning, Nabal was sober, so his wife told him everything. He had a heart attack and became as stiff as a rock. About ten days later, the LORD gave him a stroke and Nabal died", **1 Samuel 25:36-38 ERV**. People that live under false perceptions think that they know the best way to live a good life but they are really fooling themselves, "There is a way that people think is right, but it leads only to death", **Proverbs 14:12 ERV**. A young man told Jesus Christ that he did everything right and his question appeared to be rhetorical because in his own mind there was nothing that he had done wrong in his life, "The young man saith unto him, All these things have I kept from my youth up: what lack I yet?", **St. Matthew 19:20 KJV**. Living the good life or the so-called 'American Dream' is not the answer to Paradise, "There was a certain rich man, which was clothed in purple and fine linen, and fared sumptuously every day...the rich man also died, and was buried", **St. Luke 16, 22 KJV**. For some people, the whole story of their lives will be that they lived, they died and they were buried. They would have never entered into God's rest while on earth and they will*

not enter Paradise after death. The Lord has empathy for the poor and humble and he provides a place of rest for them, “For the LORD heareth the poor”, [Psalm 69:33 KJV](#). Those that are poor in spirit will be in God’s presence, “Blessed are the poor in spirit: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven”, [St. Matthew 5:3 KJV](#). Those living by their own efforts have challenges that they may not be able to overcome, “Then Jesus beholding him loved him, and said unto him, One thing thou lackest: go thy way, sell whatsoever thou hast, and give to the poor, and thou shalt have treasure in heaven: and come, take up the cross, and follow me. And he was sad at that saying, and went away grieved: for he had great possessions”, [St. Mark 10:21-23 KJV](#). What is God’s rest? The Saints of the past knew about the Lord’s rest and sang old spiritual hymns about the rest that God gives to His people:



Joys are flowing like a river, Since the Comforter has come;
 He abides with us forever, Makes the trusting heart His home.
 Blessed quietness, holy quietness, Blest assurance in my soul!
 On the stormy sea, Jesus speaks to me,
 He speaks peace to me, And the billows cease to roll.
 Everything is turned to gladness, All around this glorious Guest;
 Banished unbelief and sadness, **All is perfect peace and rest.**
 Like the rain that falls from heaven, Like the sunlight from the sky,
 So the Holy Spirit given, Falls upon us from on high.⁶

God’s rest is peace in our lives without worrying about anything, “Therefore take no thought, saying, What shall we eat? or, What shall we drink? or, Wherewithal shall we be clothed? (For after all these things do the Gentiles seek:) for your heavenly Father knoweth that ye have need of all these things. But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you. Take therefore no thought for the morrow: for the morrow shall take thought for the things of itself. Sufficient unto the day is the evil thereof”, [St. Matthew 6:31-34 KJV](#). Entering God’s rest is when we don’t have the extreme necessity to greatly suffer from disturbing thoughts about our mental, physical and spiritual well-being. When we give our lives over to Jesus Christ and obey God’s commands found in His Word then we have entered God’s rest. This is where Adam and Eve were before they disobeyed God’s command. The obvious question is where do we find God’s commands? We find them in His Word. What the world does not understand but what God’s people do understand is that God’s Word is a person, “In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The same was in the beginning with God. All things were made by him; and without him was not anything made that was made”, [St. John 1:1-3 KJV](#). That Word is our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, “And he was clothed with a vesture dipped in blood: and his name is called The Word of God”, [Revelation 19:13 KJV](#). Jesus Christ went to Paradise to be with the Father but he left someone here in his absence to comfort us until Jesus Christ returns back to earth, “But the Comforter, which is the Holy Ghost, whom the Father will send in my name, he shall teach you all things, and bring all things to your remembrance, whatsoever I have said unto you”, [St. John 14:26 KJV](#). We have the promise that we can enter God’s place of rest because of what Jesus did for us. God always had a place of rest for His people. Adam and Eve lost it because of their disobedience and the people in the Old Testament failed to get it because of their lack of faith. Those that did enter God’s rest had a different spirit, “But my servant Caleb was different. He follows me completely. So I will bring him into the land that he has already seen, and his people will get that land”, [Numbers 14:24 ERV](#). The message about God’s rest doesn’t help people who do not accept Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior. Only those who believe in Jesus and obey his commands are able to enter into God’s place of rest. God’s work was finished from the time he made the world. On the seventh day God rested from all his work but unbelievers and the disobedient will never enter into God’s place of rest. If you hear God’s voice today, don’t be stubborn but obey and respond to His call of salvation, “To day if ye will hear his voice, harden not your hearts”, [Hebrews 4:7 ERV](#). God rested after he finished his work. So, everyone who enters into God’s place of rest will also have rest from their own work just as God did.

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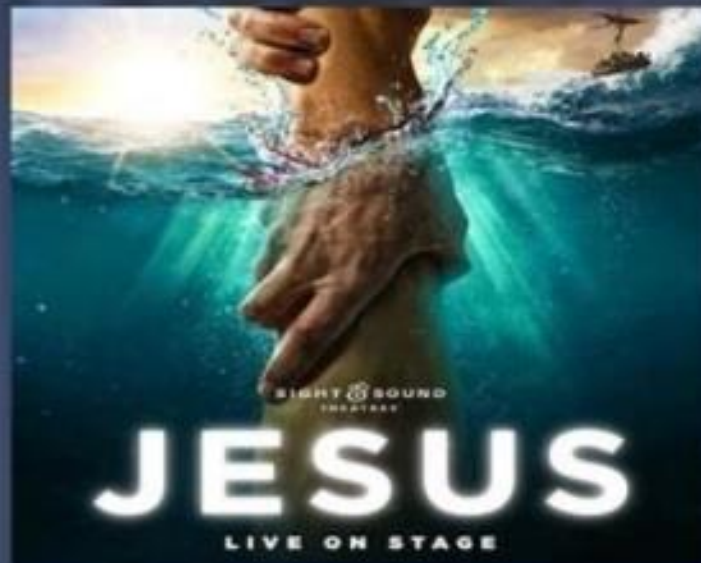
